

Paul Hebert – Professor, Department of Integrative Biology, University of Guelph (Canada)

Paul Hebert has a PhD in Genetics from Cambridge University (UK) and a DSc (*Honoris causa*) from the University of Waterloo (Canada). He holds a Canada Research Chair in Molecular Biodiversity at the University of Guelph where he is also Director of the Biodiversity Institute of Ontario. Hebert has authored more than 350 papers which have attracted more than 15,000 citations. His early work on breeding system evolution and population genetics of aquatic organisms attracted substantial interest, but he is best known for pioneering the development of a global DNA-based identification system. He currently serves as Scientific Director of the International Barcode of Life Project, the largest research program ever undertaken in biodiversity genomics.
